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

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Indian Overseas Congress, USA 2024 Year-end Wrap-up celebrations

NEW YORK; IOC.USA leaders, members, families and friends joined together at its annual meet to celebrate its successful activities in 2024 on November 22, 2024 in Manhattan, New York where over 120 attendees partook in the celebrations and the holiday festivities under auspice of its President Mohinder Singh Gilzian who welcomed the members and the guests and thanked them for their hard work in 2024 and, noting that, although the Indian Congress Party missed the mark by a very small margin, it had nonetheless leaped forward in the Lok Sabha elections to the forefront causing jitters to BJP.

Sri Rahul Gandhi made a quick short visit to USA following the Lok Sabha elections where he addressed IOC officers and members, Diplomats, Think Tanks, universities, students, businessmen, investors, international media, U.S. Congressmen, the Indian diaspora and friends. He was warmly received in Dallas and Washington D.C. where huge crowds greeted him and rejoiced his success. The evening began by Secretary-General Harbahan Singh giving a rousing and a warm welcome to everyone. He had just returned from India after the campaign season for Vidhan Sabha Elections in Haryana and three other states and expressed great satisfaction in the efforts of the Indian Congress Party especially in Jammu and Kashmir. Vice President Baldev Randhawa, who provided heavy lift support himself, in his speech, paid special tribute to members who successfully supported IOC.USA in hosting Shri Rahul Gandhi during all his recent visits to USA.

Pradeep Samala, Working President of North-East Zone of IOC.USA

recognized several leaders and supporters of the National Congress Party. New Jersey Chapter president Pradip Kothari, who had brought a contingent of over 15 members to the event was very proud of his team and their efforts. He expressed confidence that the Congress Party will triumph in the future. Other important leaders who spoke included: General Secretary Sophia Sharma, President of New York Chapter of IOC.USA Imran Pasha, President of Karnataka Chapter of IOC.USA Rajiv Gowda, former President of Kerala Chapter Ms. Leela Maret, and distinguished members from the audience like Dr. Anurita Kapur and Mahesh Patel. The reception ended with cheers and all the attendees in a total joyful mood having once again cemented firmly their bonds of comradery with each other.

Trump to expel transgenders from US military after taking office: Report

US President-elect Donald Trump is targets. Trump, 78, has criticised what likely to pass an executive order that he calls "woke" practices in the military, would expel transgender service members from the military, The Times reported, while citing defence sources. Soon after taking over office on January 20 next year, Trump is reportedly preparing to sign the orders banning transgender people from the US military. The move would medically discharge transgender people from the US military. The orders banning the armed forces, citing medical costs and disruption. The ban came into force in 2019. However, President Joe Biden reversed that policy after from the armed forces and declare them unfit to serve. The orders would also impose a ban on transgender members joining the military, coming at a time when nearly all branches of the US armed forces are struggling to meet recruitment goals. The executive order is one of many actions President-elect Trump

plans to take upon returning to the White House, including broad measures on immigration. All of these actions are expected to face significant legal challenges. During his campaign, Trump, aligning with Republican groups that spent tens of millions on anti-trans ads targeting a group that makes up less than 1 percent of the US population, vowed to roll back critical civil rights protections for the LGBT+ community. He pledged to block transgender students from participating in sports or using bathrooms corresponding to their gender identities and plans to ban gender-affirming healthcare for transgender youth nationwide, The Independent reported.

Women-Focused Cash Schemes Are Here To Stay

The Maharashtra and Jharkhand elections have seen the incumbent alliances retain power, defying anti-incumbency. Their wins are being attributed to the direct cash transfer schemes they launched just months before the elections. The ruling parties in both the states have returned with more seats than they held previously.

Two women-centric schemes paid off handsomely for the incumbents in each state - the Maharashtra Mahayuti's Mukhyamantri-Majhi Ladki Bahin Yojana, providing ₹ 1,500 a month to women; and the JMM-led government's Maiya Samman Yojana providing ₹ 1,000 a month. These elections also witnessed a large turnout of women voters. It can be concluded that cash transfer, in whatever name, is the gamechanger. In Maharashtra, the Mahayuti has promised to increase the Ladki Bahin allowance from ₹ 1,500 a month to ₹ 2,100, and so has the JMM in Jharkhand - from ₹ 1,000 to ₹ 2,500. This means more pressure on the states' treasury.

Success of DBT

In October 2022, both the IMF (International Monetary Fund) and the World Bank had praised India's DBT (direct benefit transfers) and how it had managed to transfer cash support to millions of people, benefiting especially the women, elderly and the farmers. Initially, it was just the Central government trans-



ferring money to the poor under its various schemes. But soon the states realised the benefit of DBT in electoral politics. Those in favour of DBT, especially state governments who introduced the schemes and reaped electoral benefits, say it provides the poor a greater variety of choices, increasing consumption unlike seen before.

In the 2021 West Bengal assembly election, Mamata Bannerjee dodged anti-incumbency and her party Trinamool Congress won with a bigger majority, mainly due to the 'Lakshmir Bhandar' scheme for women. The Congress came to power in Karnataka in May 2023 riding on its Gruha Lakshmi and YuvaNidhi schemes among many other promises, which was later

adapted as the Mahalakshmi scheme for the Telangana election in December 2023, where too the Congress won. The only aberration is Jagan Mohan Reddy in Andhra Pradesh; his 'Jagananna Amma Vodi' launched in 2020 failed to ensure his win in the 2024 state election. The BJP, which has always been strongly critical of what it calls the 'revadi' culture - comparing poll sops to a popular sweet - too has

tasted election victory due to various DBT schemes for women and farmers, in Madhya Pradesh, Haryana and now in Maharashtra. In the 2023 Madhya Pradesh election, the Shivraj Singh Chouhan government's Ladli Behna scheme proved to be the reason for the BJP's stunning turnaround against all odds, including 20 years of anti-incumbency. The party even scored 54 more seats than its previous tally, leaving the Congress in shock.

"DBT significantly contributes to women's empowerment by increasing access to financial resources and giving women autonomy in household decision-making. It also enhances the social and economic status of women in the society," says Abhash Kumar, assistant professor of economics, Atma Ram Sanatan Dharma College, Delhi University. The Election Commission says there has been a 5% surge in voters in Maharashtra, led by women. While 2,53,90,647 women voted in the 2019 assembly polls, 3,06,49,318 women voted on November 20 - an increase of 52,58,671 voters. In Jharkhand, women voters outnumbered the male in terms of voting percentage across 68 of the 81 assembly segments. Interestingly, women voters outnumbered the male voters by 5,51,797 across the state, according to election officials. "The implementation of women-focused DBT schemes correlates with positive political outcomes for ruling parties in states. These women specific schemes have swayed women voters," Abhash Kumar explains.

Burden versus benefit

The cash transfers have cost the state exchequer substantially.

It is estimated that in Maharashtra, the ₹ 2,100 monthly to 'poor beneficiaries' will cost over ₹ 5,000 crore a month. Other benefits, including the promise of higher pension by the ruling alliance, will likely add an annual burden of ₹ 60,000 crore in Maharashtra. Jharkhand's increased payout of ₹ 2,500 to some 48 lakh women beneficiaries is likely to push up its outlay to ₹ 14,400 crore. This, despite the state accruing huge benefits from tax on minerals due to a favourable Supreme Court verdict. The latest electoral success of DBT, may result in political parties resorting to the magical wand in other states where elections are due. Political leaders will not hesitate to sacrifice long-term fiscal stability for short-term electoral gains. While the scheme offers financial relief, its execution may worsen states' precarious financial situation.

"When multiple schemes operate simultaneously the cumulative expenditure is huge and results in limiting funds for growth projects and infrastructure development," says Kumar.

"Moreover, there are challenges in identifying genuine beneficiaries, which leads to misallocations of resources. DBT also increases dependency on the government and reduces active labour participation in the market," he adds. Reports say the BJP is planning to replicate its Maharashtra strategy in Delhi, where elections are due in February. A similar strategy has been AAP's poll plank since its debut in electoral politics. Women-focused initiatives are set to play a central role in BJP's electoral promises not just for Delhi but also in Bihar next year. The party is also planning to introduce a DBT scheme for women in its manifesto. Bihar is set to vote for a new government in November next year. The increasing attention on women as a target voter group has shifted electoral dynamics in several states. Sadly, good politics often sets the stage for bad economics.


Rama breaks Shiva danus and weds Sita

Ignoring the formalities, with his famous weapon axe hanging on his right shoulders and a mighty bow on his left hand, Parashurama, the son of saintly Brahmin Jamadagni addressed Rama "Hey Rama, I heard the news that you broke the bow of Shiva at Mithila. Years ago, the celestial Architect Vishwakarma once made two identical bows and presented to Lord Shiva and Vishnu. Do you know that it was that bow that Lord Shiva discarded after he failed in a combat against lord Vishnu? The bow used by Vishnu is here with me which is far more pow-

erful. Now show me your real valour by holding this bow and shooting an arrow from it!"

Dasaratha, gripped in fear said, "Oh mighty Brahmin; I have heard that you had stopped your killing spree, donated the kingdoms won by you to saint Kashyapa and retired to Mahendra hills to engage in austerities. I beg you not to harm my son and if done, none of us would live any longer."

However, totally unperturbed, Rama accepted the challenge. He picked up the Vishnu Danus with ease from the hand of Parashurama, mounted the arrow, pulled the string and aimed it against Parashurama. With words brimming with anger, Rama addressed Parashurama: "Now I have done what you have challenged me to do. The arrow mounted and drawn on this great bow shall not go waste without hitting a target. Great Parashurama, tell me what should I hit with it; I don't want to kill you because you are a Brahmin and hence respectable; with this I can either destroy the power you have attained to be a deathless and swift wanderer or the privilege of higher worlds you are entitled to enjoy gained by you through your austerities!"

Parashurama stood stupefied; his pride thus crushed by Rama, he became sober; he immediately understood that the person who handled Vishnu Danus with such an ease was none other than lord Vishnu in



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human form. He prayed to Rama: "Hail, hail, Oh Vishnu, the lord of all Gods! I wish to retain my prowess to be a swift wanderer on this earth. You may please destroy my path to reach the higher worlds with arrow!" Rama shot the arrow and destroyed the fortune of higher worlds and Parashurama. After reverently circumambulating Rama, Parashurama swiftly left the place to return to Mehendra hills where he was meditating earlier.

The marriage party soon returned to Ayodhya. A grand reception awaited them there.

Happy life at Ayodhya

The newlywed royal couples settled in their palaces in Ayodhya and enjoyed their life thoroughly. Sita, who was verily the incarnate of Lakshmi (the consort of Lord Vishnu) showered love on Rama with her beauty, behavior and words; "She was so much tuned to Rama that she could read Rama's mind and act according to his wish without the need of words. Rama with his pleasing manners and manly personality loved Sita from the bottom of his heart."

After some days passed, Yudajit, the maternal uncle of Bharata visited Ayodhya with the intention of taking Bharata with him to his father's kingdom Kekeya. Accompanied by Shatrughna, Bharata bid farewell to parents and brothers and left for Kekeya. Rama assisted his father in the administrative aspects of Government. Can You Understand the Truth of Life? Trapped by Desire

The renowned poet-philosopher Allama Iqbal offers a profound warning:

*iAe tair-e-lahooti, us rizq se maut achi,
Jis rizq se aati ho parwaaz mein kotahi.* (O heavenly bird, death is better than sustenance That hinders the flight of your spirit toward greatness.)

Iqbal's words remind us of the perils of indulging in transient gains at the cost of spiritual elevation. The sustenance we often chase—be it material wealth or fleeting pleasure—can diminish our ability to soar toward higher purposes.

The Tale of the Hook

In the serene depths of a river, a young fish notices a tempting morsel of meat dangling on the surface. Her instincts urge her to seize the opportunity. Just as she prepares to bite, an old, wise fish intercepts her path and warns:

iDo not be deceived by appearances. That meat hides a hook. Bite it, and you'll be pulled from the water and meet a grim end. The fisherman's trap will seal your fate.

The young fish dismisses the warning, convinced it's an exaggeration. She reasons, iThe waters are calm, and there's no sign of danger. The old fish clings to superstitions. But the moment she bites the bait, the hidden hook pierces her flesh. She struggles in vain as the fisherman reels her in. What she had dismissed as mere stories unfolds before her eyes—the hook, the knife, the boiling oil, and the waiting mouths.

A Reflection on Human Lives

This tale mirrors our own lives. The bait represents the fleeting pleasures of this world—wealth, fame, power—seducing us with the illusion of fulfillment. The hook symbolizes the consequences of succumbing to these temptations, often hidden until it's too late.

The wise old fish is akin to the Prophets and sages who guide humanity, warning of the perils of worldly attachments and urging us to focus on eternal truths. Their wisdom is a beacon in a world overshadowed by materialism.

Iqbal captures this wisdom in another timeless verse:

iGohar-e-murad milta hai faqat khudi ke sahil se,

Ye maiali jazira tere hi andar chhupa hai. (The pearl of destiny lies on the shores of selfhood;

This exalted isle is hidden within your soul.) True fulfillment, Iqbal suggests, lies within, not in the external pursuits that often deceive us.

The Illusions of Modernity

In today's world, we often prioritize tangible evidence over intangible truths. The advancements of science and reason have led many to dismiss faith and spirituality as outdated. Like the skeptical young fish, we view the warnings of ancient wisdom as irrelevant in modern times.

Yet the reality remains: death is inevitable. No amount of progress can shield us from the impermanence of life. Iqbal beautifully emphasizes this truth:

iMaut Ko Samjhay Hain Ghafil Ikhtetaam-e-Zindagi,

Hai Ye Shaam-e-Zindagi, Subha Dawaam-e-Zindagi. (The imprudent ones consider death as the end of life;

This apparent evening of life is the morning of perpetual life!)

In this verse, Allama Iqbal invites us to reconsider the way we view death and the

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journey of life. The *imprudent ones* refers to those who perceive death merely as the final end of existence. This limited understanding fails to grasp the deeper, eternal truth that life is not confined to the physical realm we know.

Iqbal compares life to a cycle of day and night, where what we perceive as the evening—a symbol of decline, death, or the end of life—is actually part of a greater, ongoing process.

The *apparent evening* represents the conclusion of the material world, but it is also the threshold of a new beginning: the *morning of perpetual life.* This morning, according to Iqbal, is not confined to the limitations of time and space but signifies the eternal life that transcends physical death.

Through this poetic insight, Iqbal emphasizes that death should not be feared or seen as an end but as a transition into a more enduring, spiritual existence. The illusions of modernity often blind us to this eternal truth, and through his verse, Iqbal urges us to look beyond the ephemeral nature of worldly existence and embrace the infinite possibilities of life beyond.

The Eternal Choice

The fisherman's bait is not an act of cruelty but a reflection of natural order. Similarly, the challenges we face in life are tests of our

choices. The Prophets, like the wise old fish, have fulfilled their duty by guiding us. Whether we heed their advice or dismiss it depends on us.

Iqbal urges us to rise above mediocrity through his profound couplets:

iApne Mann Mein Doob Kar Pa Ja Suragh-E-Zindagi,

Tu Agar Mera Nahin Banta Na Bann, Apna To Bann. (iPani Pani Kar Gyi Mujh Ko Qalandar Ki Ye Baat,

Tu Jhuka Jab Ghair Ke Agay, Na Mann Tera Na Tann. (iDelve into your soul and there seek our life's buried tracks;

Will you not be mine? then be not mine, be your own right! (iThe hermit's saying left me in distress, You forfeit body and soul alike, once you bow to another's might!

In these verses, Iqbal speaks to the core of human existence, urging us to look within for the true purpose of our lives. The first couplet encourages self-exploration: to dive deep into our own soul to discover the hidden path of life. The *buried tracks* symbolize the innate truths that lie within each of us, waiting to be uncovered.

Iqbal's message is clear: true fulfillment comes not from seeking external sources of validation but from aligning ourselves with our authentic inner selves.

The second part of the couplet emphasizes the power of personal choice. Iqbal asserts that even if someone chooses not to align with him, they should not lose themselves in the process. *iBe your own right!* calls for self-

empowerment and authenticity. This is a call to not depend on anyone for one's true self, but to forge one's own path.

In the second couplet, Iqbal evokes the mystic wisdom of the Qalandar (a term used for a wandering, ascetic mystic). The words *iPani Pani Kar Gyi Mujh Ko Qalandar Ki Ye Baat* refer to the disillusionment that struck Iqbal after hearing the Qalandar's teachings. These teachings suggest that true freedom and spiritual greatness come when one is free from the influence of external forces, particularly when one refuses to bow to anyone other than the Divine. *iYou forfeit body and soul alike if once you cringe to another's might!* reflects the idea that surrendering to worldly power compromises the integrity of both body and soul.

Through these verses, Iqbal calls us to rise above the mundane, to pursue spiritual self-realization, and to maintain integrity in the face of external pressures. It is through this inner strength and unwavering self-awareness that we transcend the challenges of life and find our true purpose. The choice is eternal: whether we succumb to the world's distractions or seek to align with our higher calling is the eternal test of our soul.

Bottom Line: Embracing Timeless Wisdom

Time is fleeting. Just as the fish cannot return to the water once caught, we cannot revisit this life once it ends. Let us not waste our precious moments chasing illusions. Instead, let us embrace the wisdom of the Prophets and poets, preparing ourselves for the eternal journey that lies ahead.

For while the hook is inevitable, how we choose to swim in the river of life—heedless or aware—is entirely up to us.

Wall Street veteran Scott Bessent tapped as Donald Trump's treasury secretary

President-elect Donald Trump on Friday said he will nominate prominent investor Scott Bessent as US Treasury secretary, ending days of twists that saw high profile candidates pitted against each other for the cabinet position with vast influence over economic, regulatory and international affairs. 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

Will banning men from tailoring shops and salons make women safe?

Gender segregation implies that women require constant protection, thereby undermining their agency and professionalism. Preventing male tailors from taking women's measurements reinforces the notion of women's dependency for protection. Such policies generalize men as a potential threat, creating mistrust and harming workplace dynamics. Segregation reinforces stereotypes rather than addressing harassment. Analyze how segregation of occupations by gender reinforces stereotypes rather than addressing underlying issues of harassment. Although segregation of occupations by gender is often proposed as a preventive measure against harassment, it risks reinforcing stereotypes and gender-based roles. Recent regulations, such as gender-specific staffing in tailoring shops and unisex salons, have failed to address the root causes of harassment, such as social attitudes, inequality, and lack of awareness. A more holistic approach focused on systemic changes is necessary to achieve gender equality and safety.

Social beliefs often portray women as weak and men as aggressive, promoting unequal gender dynamics that perpetuate harassment. Studies conducted by the National Institutes of Health show that workplace harassment disproportionately affects women because patriarchal attitudes are ingrained. Many people, including employers and employees, are unaware of workplace harassment laws, leading to unchecked misconduct. Only 35% of Indian women employees are aware of the Sexual Harassment Prevention Act, 2013. Inefficient implementation of laws and lack of



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accountability embolden harassers. The Nirbhaya Fund (2013) allocated for women's safety remains underutilized due to poor governance. The low representation of women in certain occupations creates a male-dominated environment, prone to abuse of power. According to the Economic Survey 2023-2024, the female labor force participation rate has increased, but it remains at around 37%. Fear of justice, victim blaming, or retribution discourages victims from reporting harassment, perpetuating a culture of silence. According to National Crime Records Bureau data, crimes against women, including sexual harassment, are grossly underreported due to fear of repercussions, inadequate awareness, and social prejudices.

Gender segregation implies that women require constant protection, thereby undermining their agency and professionalism. Preventing male tailors from taking women's measurements reinforces the notion of women's dependency for protection. Such policies generalize men as a potential threat, creating distrust and

harming workplace dynamics. Studies show that inclusive work environments foster greater respect and cooperation between the sexes. Segregation maintains unequal opportunities, restricting participation in occupations dominated by one gender. India's armed forces have historically barred women from combat roles, reflecting the impact of segregation on professional opportunities. Reforms such as NDA induction represent progress, but prejudices persist. Rather than addressing social attitudes, segregation targets symptoms while leaving root causes such as power imbalances and poor education untouched. The National Crime Bureau Report (2023) highlighted that a significant proportion of crimes against women under the IPC were linked to cruelty by husband or his relatives. Segregation reduces the client base for male professionals, which disproportionately affects people from lower-income groups. In smaller towns or villages where unisex salons may not be available, such practices may reduce job opportunities for male barbers. Launch

comprehensive awareness campaigns focusing on respect, consent, and workplace ethics to tackle the root of harassment. The POSH Act, 2013 mandates training sessions, which should be extended to informal sectors such as tailoring and salons. Promote mixed-gender staffing in businesses to develop mutual understanding and reduce stereotyping. Initiatives such as UN Women's He for She campaign encourage men and women to collaborate equally in diverse settings. Ensure strict implementation of anti-harassment laws and create robust mechanisms for grievance redressal. Expanding internal complaint committees in informal sectors can protect vulnerable workers. Instead of surveillance, prioritize safe infrastructure such as private fitting rooms and customer-friendly layouts. Provide financial and training support to professionals affected by restrictive regulations, thereby securing their livelihoods. Government-funded skill enhancement programs under the National Urban Livelihoods Mission (NULM, 2013) can help barbers and tailors diversify their clientele. Segregating occupations by gender is a superficial response that reinforces stereotypes while failing to address systemic issues of oppression. By promoting inclusive workplaces, strengthening legal protections, and promoting behavioral change, India can build a society rooted in equality and respect. Taking inspiration from global best practices like the He for She campaign, India must strive for a future where safety and respect are inherent, not imposed.

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
